Revamp your Resume

- Ensure your resume is [ATS-friendly](#) -- gotta get it past the recruiting software.
- Ensure that it is [quantified](#). It should have \$ signs in it. Once you get it past the bots, it needs to stand out enough for the recruiter to want you for an interview.

Read the [Hiring Process](#)

- Online Application
- Assessments – Personality Tests – Are you a good culture fit for Amazon?
- Phone Interview – Pay attention to Leadership Principles
- In-Person Interview – (actually, their Remote Web Conference Interview using their in-house [Chime](#) tool) Just like the phone interview, but face-to-face, using STAR method

*Software Engineers have to do all of the above plus [Code Reviews](#).

**Warehouse / Fulfillment jobs have a different process (click [here](#)).

Prepare your Resume for EACH Job Posting and Submit Online

- Are you at [least 50% qualified](#)?
- Did you do the [copy paste trick](#)? Or at least, include as many **keywords** from the job posting's qualifications and skills into the resume. You have to get it past the recruiting algorithm.

Well Before Your Interview – Preparation is Everything

- Study my [interview tips](#) on my site -- they are very detailed and cover everything you need to get hired from social stalking the interviewers to tactfully asking for the next steps when you're done with the interview.
- Buy [lighting](#) or try to schedule your interview early or make sure you're in a well-lit room next to a window or something. First impressions are everything.
- Re-read and study the [Hiring Process](#), especially the Leadership principles.
- Study the [Sample Answers](#) I gave for the Amazon interview questions on my site.
- [Search LinkedIn for actual Amazon recruiters and hiring managers](#) to DM them, if you want! Normally, I don't promote this activity but with huge companies like Amazon, you are a needle in the haystack, so you have to stand out. 📌
- Using the job requirements, google search common interview questions, and answer them using this [STAR technique interview prep template](#) from Microsoft templates!
- Install their in-house [Chime](#) tool and test it out.
- Print your resume and all your notes.

- Buy interview clothes if you need to, but don't forget simple is best. Amazon has guidelines on their interview attire. They even recommend simple, clean attire. I think a plain and simple dress shirt is always the best way to go. This isn't a fashion show! LOL

1-2 Hours Before Your Interview – First Impressions

- Find a quiet, well-lit room, and set up your lights and webcam, if possible.
- If possible, don't use a wireless connection – plug in your laptop directly into your modem so you don't lose internet connection during your interview!
- Test the [Chime](#) tool again – you never know if a software update didn't happen overnight.
- Spread out your notes, resume, water bottle (so you don't make a lot of sound), pen, and notepad.
- Put your cell on MUTE – don't forget. 🙊 🙇
- Close any other programs on your laptop or press F11 to go into Full Screen mode.
- Call into the conference a few minutes early – DO NOT BE LATE!

During the Interview

- Also, don't worry about not knowing everything. No one knows everything. If you're interviewing for a Junior role, they know and they won't expect you to know EVERYTHING.
